

2019 was an exhilarating and productive year at the library:

- Completed our migration to the MILS circulation system, bringing us into alignment
 with many other libraries within the state, facilitating interlibrary loans, making more
 titles available to patrons, and allowing us to engage in more resource sharing with
 other libraries;
- Joined the pilot Maine Reciprocal Borrowing Program, which allows our patrons to check items out from Rockland, Rockport, Camden and other libraries throughout the state with their Thomaston Public Library card;
- Rearranged our collections so the books frequently sought by the majority of our patrons are now on the main floor, created a designated quiet space, and moved the children's area downstairs;
- Presented our sixth fantastic 40 Days of Summer program for area youth, filling the summer with games, science experiments, music, healthy lunches, lots of sunshine, and culminating in an End-of-Summer Party with a barbecue and, the kids' favorite, a "Dunk the Librarian" tank as a prize for summer reading;
- Began offering a senior core exercise class, led by Sandy Bodamer, Senior Activities
 Director from the YMCA, on Tuesdays and Thursdays in our Community Conference
 Room;
- Hosted three enthusiastic book clubs, including the Maine Humanities Council sponsored Let's Talk About It series, the long-running Intergenerational Book Club, and the new Mystery Book Club;
- Continued our extremely successful monthly programs Communi-TEA and Family Movie & Pizza Night, with 30 50 people regularly attending each event;
- Offered a number of engaging and well-attended presentations and author visits, including our Annual Poetry Reading, Northern Stars Planetarium, Maine author Jeffrey Ryan, and women's suffrage historian Anne B. Gass;
- Continued our renovations on the entry way with fresh paint and further plans for improved lighting, new signage, and better railings.

2020 is off to a similarly terrific start with many exciting programs planned, including our seventh 40 Days of Summer, and, of course, amazing books and movies being released all the time to add to our collection! We are grateful to be your community living room and are eagerly anticipating a new decade in Thomaston.
